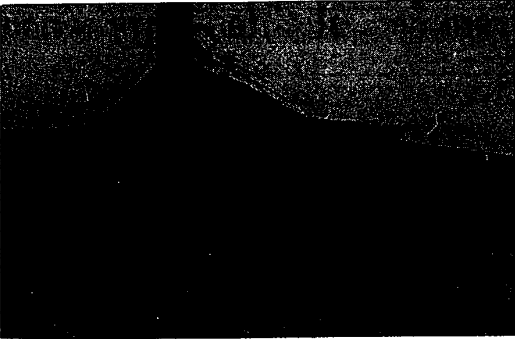

### Council's Patron Saint Among Most Popular

On October 4, the Catholic Church will commemorate the 75th anniversary of the death of St. Francis of Assisi in 1226. No other saint has had the enduring devotion and popularity of Francis among the faithful, nor has any prominent historical figure, saint or otherwise, had so profound an effect for good on the human race during the more than seven centuries past.

St. Francis has been the subject of more Papi Enechicals, books and pamphlets, than any saint in Church history.

Founder of three great Religious Orders, but never ordained a Priest, the teachings of this pious and humble servant of God continue to influence the lives of people everywhere, long after his passing.

One of his many biographers, Isidore O'Brien, O.F.M., refers to the holy Francis as the "Mirror of Christ" for by his saintly life and the "stigmata" which he bore, he truly exemplified the life of the Saviour.

OUTSIDE OF THE Catholic Church, many sincere members of other faiths, and some non-faith at all, hold St. Francis in the highest esteem, and regularly recite his most famous prayers:

"Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace! Where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy. O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled, as to console; to be understood, as to understand; to be loved, as to love; for it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; it is in dying that we are born to eternal life."
