6. Name plates and signs as
provided in ARTICLE XII
GENERAL PROVISIONS.
7. Automobile parking spaces
to be provided as required in
ARTICLE XV GENERAL
PROVISIONS.
SECTION ON USES PER
MISSIBLE ON SPECIAL AP
PROVAL:

Under such conditions as the
Board of Appeals, after having
received the recommendation of
the Planning Board, finds that
the use is not being imposed to
the detriment of the public health
and safety and is not contrary to
the spirit and purpose of this
ordinance, such use shall be per
mitted.
8. Private offices as accessory
to a multiple dwelling and pres
ent.


