Mrs. Romney to Speak Fri., GOP Caravan Set Sat.

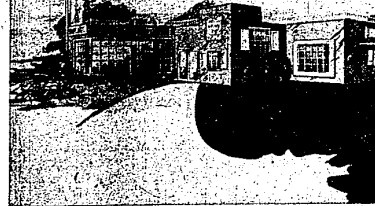
An appearance by Mrs. George Romney on Friday and a caravan tour of Republican candidates throughout Farmington, City and Township on Saturday have been announced.

2 Twp. Schools Receive Drills Under CD Plan

There are 441 youngsters attending classes at the Edgewood Elementary School, 9225 St. Francis Street in Farmington Township, and last week during their third Civil Defense evacuation drill it took them just one minute and 30 seconds to reach their assigned areas of safety after principal William E. Jackson had pushed the alarm buzzer.

The Farmington Township Civil Defense Department, under the direction of Russ Conway and headed by Township Supervisor Curt Hall, has begun the evacuation drills at two Township elementary schools and hopes to soon expand the program to all schools in the area.

Grant Approval On 3 Licenses

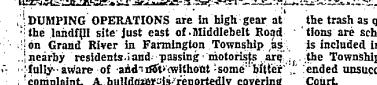
Approval was granted by the Farmington Township Board at its regular meeting Monday evening, October 22, on three separate requests for permits to operate businesses in the Township.
