Area Schools Test Project

Social studies teachers, administrators and school board members from local schools will hear a progress report of the Oakland County Social Studies Curriculum Project Wednesday, Oct. 31.

Dr. Myles Platt, Director of Social Studies for the Oakland County Board of Education, has announced that the work done thus far on the project will be explained and displayed from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at the Board of Education offices in Pontiac.

MRS. NORMA KITZMAN, kindergarten teacher in the Clarenceville Schools, is one of eight Oakland County teachers assigned to work with Dr. Platt to revitalize the social studies curriculum.

The teacher group began the project to develop content and sequence in the social studies on September 5. The target date for completion of their work is the end of the fall semester.

Material developed on teaching concepts, skills and attitudes in social studies has already been tested in Clarenceville kindergartens.

Following a report by Dr. Platt, visitors will watch a 30-minute demonstration of materials developed by project teachers. Maps, bulletin boards, charts, and other teaching aids will be on display. The report will conclude with a panel discussion by project teachers and classroom teachers who have been using the new curriculum material.

School districts contributing to the social science project are Farmington, Southfield, Oxford, Clarenceville, Pontiac, Hazel Park and Huron Valley.

Safety Officer Delivers Talk

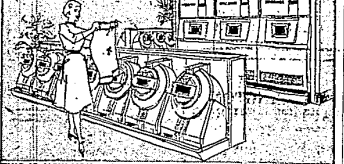

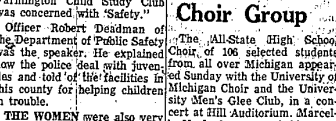
