The Raiders of North Farmington clashed with the Falcons of Groves last Thursday with the game ending in a 7-7 tie.

The Falcons, whose first and only tally came in the first quarter accompanied by the extra point, took command of the game from the start. The situation looked as if it might remain unchanged when the Groves defenders were caught off guard. The seldom passing Raiders suddenly took to the air on a scoring pass from John Keat to Gary Kontak. This put North Farmington just one yard away from the Falcons goal line. Jim Listermann ran the yardage for the extra point and the score was tied at 7-7. The score remained the same all through the second half as both teams fought hard to attain victory.

It was the fourth win in five tries for the Farmington school and their largest scoring output in its short athletic history.

Farmington dropped a tough, 14-0 game at Berkley last Friday to lose ground on Conference leader Waterford which remained undefeated in gaining an easy victory over Southfield. Waterford had handed the Falcons their first loss in the League and appear to be running away with the Championship this year.

AFTER GAINING an upset victory a week earlier from dear old Farmington by clinching 16 a u o championship, Farmington was stopped cold on the Berkley gridiron. The Falcons failed to muster a serious threat after their opening series of drive when a Berkley interception halted them.

Defensively both teams were able to contain the attacks inaugurated for the first three quarters of play. Berkley's lone marker came in the fourth period on a quarterback sneak which capped a 59 yard drive by the Bears. The scoring march was engineered in 14 plays with Dick Kakuri of the Bears going over on the one yard line. Kakuri also tallied on a 70-yard pass interception which was nullified by a Berkley penalty.
