Civil Defense No Exceptions On Truck Ord.

Exceptions to the City ordinance which prohibits commercial pickups and other small commercial trucks from being kept outside in residential neighborhoods will not be made, members of the City Council emphasized unanimously Monday night.

This was the firm stand taken when a complaint was registered by Mack Francis, 22745 Hawthorne St., against the ordinance. He felt that he should not have to abide by it in view of the fact that his home is located directly across the street from a trucking firm's property where a number of big trucks and other heavy equipment are kept outside day and night.

The general feeling was expressed by members of the Council that while a commercial truck being out at the Francis property might not be detrimental to the neighborhood it would be considered so in most neighborhoods. Restrictions must be universal for the whole city, it was stated.
