The theme, "More Power to Parents," was taken from the PTA magazine. Mr. Otto Yntema, in his greetings to the assembly has noted significant changes in the 1950's and greater changes are expected in the next ten years. The Library Extension Service represented by Mrs. Flinders, referred to the display of the many books in the lobby regarded as good reading for each grade.

Mr. Donald Dolan briefly gave an illustration of Great Britain and Perception, stressing, "we see things as we have been trained to see them, according to our experience and background." The trust actually was more directly pointed to the parents. Mr. Cutler stressed 3 points: (1) The Primary family group has come to be a much less important reference base; (2) Transportation and communication make us more highly mobile and open to user contact with diverse behavior; and (3) We have a materially rich standard of living available to us which is beyond precedent.

"In judging our children as we seem to think we do, we are actually judging ourselves first and the children next. We have undermined the fact that it pays to wait. We are living with the idea, the sooner he can get what he wants, the better. Parents are continually following a luncheon in the Michigan Union Ballroom, a panel discussion including the 3 noted speakers and University Student and 1 High School student. Questions from the floor were collected and given the consideration of the panel. In dealing with the future, it was given approval of the panel to have a family living level taking into consideration that drop-outs start the end of the ninth and during the tenth grade is the heaviest drop period.
