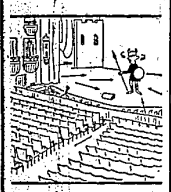


Goodwill Trucks Slated for Pick-Up

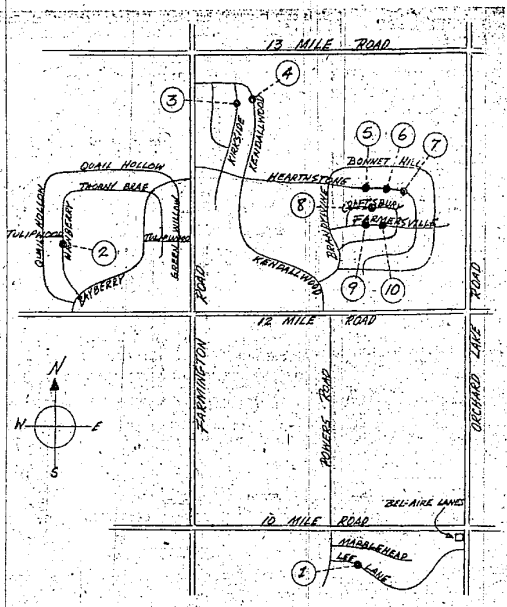
