Babson's Predictions for 1963

(Continued from Page 1-A) In 1963 will depend largely upon the attitude of the leading businessmen. If they will be optimistic and spend more on new plants, advertising, and salesmanship, we should have nothing to fear.

STOCKS AND BONDS

My father used to tell me, "It is okay, Roger, for you to make forecasts... but never put dates on them." I forecast that the Dow-Jones Industrial Average will register lower sometime during 1963 and stocks will show a decrease of about 4 percent. Either dividends must be increased or prices of stocks must go lower. Both cannot continue forever so poorly adjusted.

The above comment refers primarily to industrial stocks. I forecast that both the gross and net earnings of utility stocks will advance during 1963 and for some years thereafter. The utility cumulative preferences have reached a point whereby they will closely follow long-term bond prices with interest rates as determined by the Federal Reserve Bank. Some think the Cuban problem will not be settled in 1963. It may extend until after the 1964 presidential elections.
