

# Most City Officials to Attend District Municipal League Meet

City Manager John Dinnar, respect to the procurement and training of qualified administrative, professional and technical personnel at the local level. Committee reports and a panel of officials will add commentary. Panelists will be Charles Beaubien, City Manager, East Detroit; L. R. Gave, City Manager, Birmingham; and Paul York, Village Manager, Rochester. Village President Harry Lemen, Fenton, will be the moderator.

The topics for discussion in the second half of the afternoon program will be "The Future of Municipal Manpower," Charles Meyer, Assistant Secretary and Chief Examiner, Detroit Civil Service Commission, will discuss the recommendations of the Municipal Manpower Commission with re-

## OHIO HUNTERS BAG UNUSUAL DUCKS

The normal range of this bird is in Mexico, Texas and California. Also in Ohio, two white-winged scoters, one surf scoter and a new square drake were taken this year.

## Clinton Valley Council Establishes Trust Fund

As part of a long-range development and future growth program, the Clinton Valley Council, Boy Scouts of America, has established a trust fund to simplify and stabilize financing of its overall operations.

JOHN W. HUNT, of Farmington, Council president, who made the announcement, said that The Detroit Bank and Trust Company has been appointed trustee of the fund, which will become effective January 2, 1963.

Pointing out that the Clinton Valley Council bases its normal yearly operating budget on contributions received from the area's United Fund and Community Chest organizations, Hunt said that "the Council frequently faces specific projects of activities, camp development requirements, or extraordinary operating needs which cannot be financed in this manner."

The trust fund has been set up by the Council expressly, therefore, "as a means to help meet the additional financial burdens which such unusual demands impose," he said.

"This fund is relatively flexible in nature and broad in scope. Our Executive Board hopes that, through the receipt of special gifts and bequests to the Council, the fund will grow steadily and ultimately generate sufficient earnings to enable us to implement and carry out the Scouting program for boys in our area with maximum effectiveness."

## Edged in Nat'l Handball Meet
