Reminds of New Postal Rates, Regulations

Farmington Postmaster Henry Trombley issued a reminder to all residents and business owners this week on the new postal rates going into effect this week and also on letter size requirements now already in effect.

The increased rates on all classes of mail becomes effective Monday, January 7. Already in effect as of January 7 is a new regulation which prohibits the mailing of any post cards or letters smaller than 3 inches in depth and 4 1/2 inches in length. There is no maximum size limits on letters but post cards are still limited in size to 3 1/2 by 5 1/2 inches.

Postage rates for first class mail will be increased from four cents to five cents an ounce with air mail letters costing eight cents an ounce instead of seven.

First class post cards will cost four cents instead of three with air mail cards going from five to six cents.

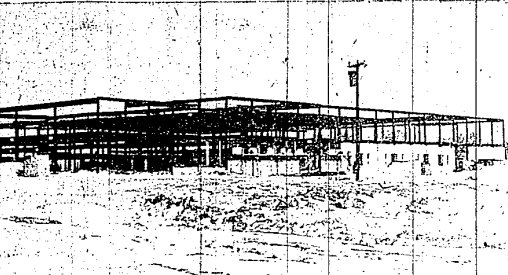

The deadline for correspondence columns and club and social news is 3 p.m. Monday with a noon Tuesday deadline for all other types of news material.

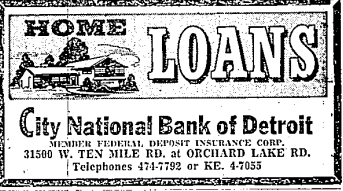
