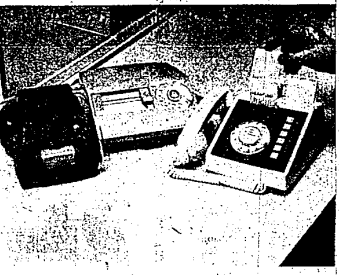

THREE NEW TELEPHONE dialers which can dial calls automatically are being offered by the Michigan Bell Telephone Company. Designed primarily for business customers, the dialers will complete calls to pre-recorded numbers. From left to right are the Dialaphone, which has a capacity of up to 850 names and numbers; the Rapid-Dial, which holds up to 250 phone numbers; and the Card Dialer, which uses pre-coded plastic cards, and has an unlimited capacity.

New Michigan Bell Telephone Dial Systems Now Available

Three new types of telephone dialers which can dial calls automatically at the tap of a finger are now available in Farmington: the Michigan Bell Telephone Company announced. The new products, called Card Dialer, Rapid-Dial, and Dialaphone, will complete calls to pre-recorded telephone numbers. Designed primarily for business use, the dialers are an aid to persons who call the same numbers frequently. THE TIME-SAVING dialers insure the accuracy of dialing, and can be used for local, long distance or intercommunication calls.

Although similar in concept, the dialers differ in capacity and appearance. The Card Dialer, with an automatic dialing mechanism built into a six-button phone, has an unlimited capacity. Pre-coded plastic cards on which the user previously has punched out the specified phone number are inserted in a slot in the phone. At the touch of the start bar, the phone "reads" the card and dials "the correct number." Space is provided in the top of the Card Dialer for filing 40 cards with the most frequently called numbers.

Rapid-Dial, used as a companion to a telephone, has a capacity of up to 250 names and numbers which can be easily

recorded or changed on magnetic tape by the user.

PHONE NUMBERS are dialed automatically by turning the directory selector knob to the desired name, lifting the receiver, and pressing the start bar.

Dialaphone, also for use with any type of telephone, holds up to 850 names and numbers. An alphabetical index aids in the selection of numbers.

The dialers are available in colors matching business phones.
