I agree with you in every detail but one. Why should the Civic Theatre be ostracized for the ill manners of other people's children. The point was made, "it will be a frosty Friday before any of us attend the Civic Theatre until this situation is remedied."

The writer opened the Civic Theatre on September 20, 1940, over twenty two years ago. For thirteen years before that, he had the experience of working in theatres as usher, doorman, assistant manager and manager. In all this time, we've never been able to arrive at a solution to the problem. This also applies to every theatre I know of, where the engagement might end up with an SRO sign.

It would take an employee for almost every person in line to eliminate the so called CUT. Unfair it is, but no remedy is available, except in the way you are rearing your children.

I assure you, mine was reared to respect other people's rights, but I feel the point of being respectful to others is not being unduly taken. The SRO sign is not out very often — in the very best we can — try to be friendly and courteous. This also applies to being impartial — give the best service to the community we are capable of giving.

For you, or anyone else that has the corresponding experience of being CUT in front of, or being turned away, my personal apology, but it was beyond my control.

One final comment, in the future as in the past, when the theatre is sold out, we discount seating tickets. Once again, not often, but if it is, there usually remain twenty or so children who have no money to call mine. We take them to the office one a time and call their parents. Now the problem arises, we get no response. Are we to put the children out in the cold or have them wait for three hours to watch the show?

We said them, others get out of their seats to purchase candy or use the rest room facility, get a drink — you name it. When they go back to where they thought they were sitting, the theatre is full. By the fifteen or twenty children we could not get transportation for?

We are only human, and I assure you we do the very best we are capable of doing. Let us last twenty two years at the Civic Theatre Farmington, so attend. We welcome every criticism, and where possible be guided by it. Thank you.
