Navy Seeks Recruits For Weekend Warriors

High school and college students in the Farmington area who want to fulfill part of their military obligation while still in school can get full information on programs offered by the Naval Air Reserve from Chief Petty Officer William A. Bowditch, local recruiter for NAS Grosse Ile's "Weekend Warriors."

CHIEF BOWDITCH, a member of the Naval Air Reserve himself for 14 years and a Detroit schoolteacher in civilian life, has been appointed recruiter in Farmington by the naval air station. He lives in Farmington with his wife and children at 3535 Muer Cove Drive.

"Several new programs have opened up in the Naval Air Reserve that enable students to finish school while serving at NAS Grosse Ile as 'Weekend Warriors,'" said Bowditch.

"By attending drills one week each month, reservists receive training in their Navy jobs without interrupting their education," he explained. "Then when they go on active duty with the Navy at the end of their schooling, 'Weekend Warriors' step in to the Navy ready to apply the skills they have acquired, along with higher pay and advancement opportunities they've made."
