Give Hot Bath To Vegetables?

Give Hot Bath To Vegetables? If you want good flavor, color and texture in your vegetables you freeze at home, proper blanching is a must. "If the vegetables are not blanched and cooled, they might taste like an old hot 'stack'" warns Roberta Hersey, extension specialist in foods and nutrition at Michigan State University. Blanching simply means dipping the vegetables into a bath of boiling water for one minute. Blanch once vegetables for just one package in one gallon of water. Miss Hersey says, and cool immediately in cold water to stop the cooking process. The specialist says the vegetable must be heated for at least the length of time they are heated - and they must be cooled to the center. AVOID OVERCOOKING. And don't try to cook too many vegetables at once or they might not get heated or cooled through and through. Blanching stops the enzyme action that makes the vegetables grow and mature. Miss Hersey explains. After the vegetables are picked, this action simply makes the vegetables more flavorful and eventually spoil. And if the vegetables are not heated enough, the enzymes continue to be active during frozen storage. The heating also wilts or softens vegetables and makes them easier to pack. 18-1c

Science Seeks Source of Star

Science Seeks Source of Star. Since St. Matthew first described the star of Bethlehem, mankind has been fascinated by its mystery. Was it a brighter-than-usual star or other celestial object? Astronomers, the world over, are trying to identify the star, emphasizing that it may have been indeed a miracle that can't be explained in terms of natural phenomena. However, research has provided material for conjecture that the star may have been a natural occurrence. A Danish astronomer, Tycho Brahe, discovered a new and brilliant star in the constellation Cassiopeia in 1572, according to the Encyclopedia Americana. Since that discovery, the Americans say, it has been suggested that this might be the star of the middle Ages, a particularly brilliant star visible only at long intervals. A reported appearance of a bright star in that part of the heavens about the middle of the 13th century, coupled with a vague account of a similar appearance a little more than 300 years earlier, led to the thought that these might possibly be former appearances of the star of 1572. If, as this might indicate, the star appeared at intervals of 300 to 315 years, three intervals of 300-odd years from the time it was first reported would carry it back to about the time of the birth of Christ. Another theory. Johannes Kepler, a German astronomer, made discoveries that led to still another theory about the star of Bethlehem. In 1604, he observed a configuration of stars grouped in a line, planets Jupiter, Saturn and Mars. He determined that such a configuration occurred each 80 years, and calculations established that the same grouping might have appeared in 6 B.C. - which, some research indicates, may have been the correct year of Christ's birth. Since legends identify the wise men as astrologers, this theory accounts for the fact that, as reported in the New Testament, only the wise men saw the star. While the three planets grouped together would show unusual brightness, the average observer might not notice them, while the wise men, as astrologers, would. 18-1c

Early Settlers Had It Rough

Early Settlers Had It Rough. Hardly anyone questions the desirability of good highways. But one-hundred years ago, the Michigan constitution contained a provision that no state funds could be used to build roads. This was seen as a reaction against earlier attempts by state authorities to build highways. Their efforts ended in financial disaster and for many years, private companies and individuals shouldered roadbuilding chores. Some students of history recall that Michigan was mired in mud during most of the last century, and paid a heavy price for it. While settlers swarmed into Ohio, Indiana and Illinois, Michigan was bypassed, largely because of its reputation for having poor transportation. Those who settled in Michigan relied on Indian trails and animal tracks for overland travel. It wasn't until the turn of the century that the public became aware of the need for good roads. Bicyclists and the first motorized automobiles were largely responsible for this new awareness. In 1905, the Michigan State Highway Department was formed to promote the cause of better roads. At first, the department was limited to handing out money and advice to counties, 18-1c

Individual Rights Improved Under Proposed Constitution

Equal protection and anti-discrimination provisions based as the strongest in any state constitution. 2.
