Karen Schuler achieved the highest score on the knowledge and attitude test given December 4 to Senior girls at Farmington Senior High, under the sponsorship of General Mills.

This makes her eligible to compete with the winners of other high schools in Michigan for the title of state Homemaker of Tomorrow.

A \$1,500 scholarship is awarded to the state Homemaker of Tomorrow plus the opportunity to travel with her school advisor on an expense-paid educational tour of New York City, Washington D. C., and Colonial Williamsburg, Va. next spring.

During this tour the 1963 All-America Homemaker of Tomorrow and national runners up will be named. The scholarship for the winner will be raised to \$5,000.

Basis for selection of local and state winners is a test prepared and scored by Science Research Associates, Chicago. Personal observation and interviews are added factors in determining national winners.
