This workshop, incidentally, includes only the Student Council and class officers of F.H.S.; no other schools will participate.

The workshop will start on Saturday morning, March 2, will mark the starting point of the weekend, as the 50 leadership-minded F.H.S.'ers will meet at school at 8 a.m. and then proceed to the youth hostel. On Sunday the focal point of the day's activities will be a visit to the University of Michigan, where Earl C. Kelly, who will speak on developing better qualities of leadership.

The entire project will be managed by the students in cooperation with the help of Mr. George Barrons, who will also number among the chaperons of the event.
