

# Plan To Form New Leagues

The Board of Directors of North Farmington Baseball for Boys, voted unanimously to plan to proceed with the expansion of their Baseball program for older boys by accepting a franchise from the Colt Pony League of Washington, Pa.

Frank R. Reynolds, Commissioner of Baseball for the North Farmington Township area, reported to the Board that this Nationwide Baseball League, headed by Joe E. Brown, long-time movie actor and baseball "buff," has agreed to charter arrangements authorizing four Colt teams (boys aged 15 and 16) and four Pony teams boys 13 and 14.

THE DECISION to increase the League size came as a result of six months of thorough study of the Colt-Pony program by Reynolds and Bob Hutchinson, who served as past President of the North Farmington Babe Ruth League. Both men feel that further divisions of the League by age group will do much to improve the overall caliber of play.

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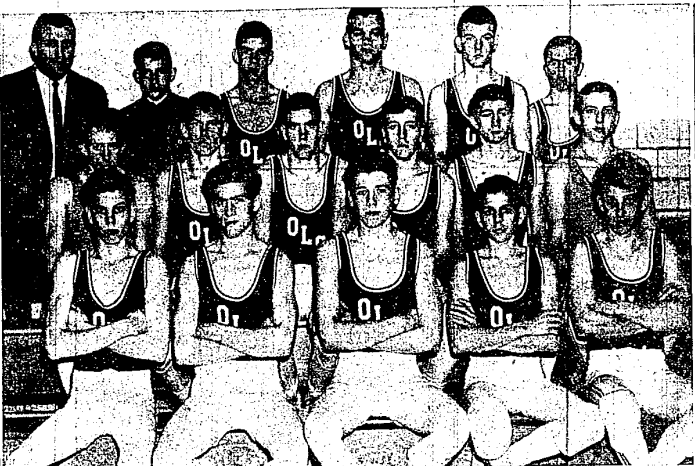

Placing in the CC Tourney were Pat Ruelle, 3rd; Mark Palmer, 4th; Fred Phillips, 2nd; Richard Korte 4th; Dave LaFont, 2nd (in a contest decided by one point on riding time in favor of the Flat Rockers); and Denny, the well-known University of Michigan football captain and wrestler of a few seasons ago; Mike LaFont, 2nd; and Chuck Dobos, 2nd.

The Lancer matmen apparently had a good warmup over the CC Tourney in the dual meet with Flat Rock, whom they crushed 24-7, on January 31.

DAVE LaFont EXTENDED a battle for three periods of dual meet wrestling matches and in three dual meet matches prior to the CC Tourney he wrestled only once in his own weight division but pinned each of his opponents.

The match started off on a weak note as Art Woelher, wrestling in the 65 lb. class was pinned by Randy Rhodes of Waterford. Ron Mortenson, wrestling for Farmington in the 103 lb. class, decided Ron Davis, 4-1. Dave Riceley proved to be too much for his opponent as he decided his man 4-1, for his second straight win.

Bill Cassel, in an effort to keep the string of victories alive, put forth a good showing as he decided his man 3-1. The team score stood 9-3 in favor of the Falcons as John Burley walked out to meet his man; 3-26 later the score read 14-3 as John, in perhaps the best match of the night, pinned the Skippers' Eric Erickson.

In the 133 lb. match, Tony Bugal one of the team's best sophomore prospects, came out on the short end of a 2-4 decision. Dave Foster, filling in the 138 lb. spot for the ailing Bruce Teehow, gave a good effort, but still dropped a 2-3 decision to the Skippers' Lloyd Elliot. Larry Kapperschmidt, wrestling in the 145 lb. class, pinned his opponent, Mike Geror, in the third period of their match.

Mike Crane, in one of the better matches of the night, pinned his 154 lb. opponent, Mike Jones, in the second period.

The team score stood 24-11 at this point as Andy Biggs, substituting for Mike Gilder in the 165 lb. class, was pinned by his man as Waterford started their comeback.
