**New Rev. Called For Lutherans**  
The Rev. George Stegmier will be installed as the Pastor of the Lutheran Church of the Incarnation, Farmington, at the congregation's 11 a.m. worship service this Sunday, February 17.  
The service will be held in the Middlebelt Elementary School, where the congregation is temporarily meeting until they can construct a building on their church site midway between Orchard Lake Road and Middlebelt Road on Ten Mile.  
PASTOR STEGMIER is a native of Grand Rapids, Michigan and a graduate with a B.S. degree from Michigan State University. He was employed in the construction industry for a time before returning to school to study theology at Hanna Divinity School of Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio where he received his B.D. Degree. He moved to Farmington with his family in June of 1961 and served as a board missionary for the Board of American Missions of the Lutheran Church in America.  
Pastor Stegmier was called by the congregation at a congregational meeting held on January 13.  
Dr. Frank P. Madsen, president of the Michigan Synod of L.O.A. will conduct the installation service and will preach the installation sermon.

**Will Dedicate New Methodist Home on Sun.**  
Dedication services for the new Boulevard Temple Methodist Home, located at 2567 West Grand Boulevard, will be held on Sunday, February 17 at 4 p.m.  
The home, to be opened about March 1, will provide a life care for 120 senior citizens for a monthly fee of \$165, including medical expenses and meals.  
Originally an apartment building erected in 1926, the structure has been converted by the Retirement Homes of the Methodist Church to accommodate a 62 bed nursing home and a 50 bed resident section, fully staffed by 45 persons, including trained nurses and medical assistants. Adjacent to the home is the Temple Methodist Church, Twelfth and West Grand, now directly connected with the home by an interior entrance for the convenience of the residents.  
Bishop Marshall R. Reed will be the speaker at the dedication on February 17. The public is cordially invited to attend the ceremonies, which will include refreshments and a tour of the building. Administration of the home is Farmington resident William Moulton, Jr., at 29724 Eleven Mile Road, Kimberley Subdivision.

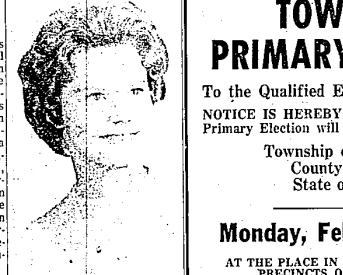
**Church Slates Next Picture In Film Series**
