New County Probate Judge

Norman R. Barnard, Oakland County Corporation Counsel, was named last week by Governor George Romney as Probate Judge of Oakland County. Earlier Judge Moore had been named to the Circuit Bench to fill the vacancy resulting from the resignation of Circuit Judge H. Russel Holland.

A native of Oakland County and a resident of Troy since 1919, Mr. Barnard had served as a Township official in Troy, having been first elected as Justice of the Peace in 1938, and later as Township Clerk and Township Supervisor.

HE WAS CHAIRMAN of the Commission which developed the Charter of the City of Troy when it incorporated in 1965.

Barnard was graduated from the University of Detroit law school in 1940 and was admitted to practice the same year. Until 1948 he was associated with a Detroit law firm, and that year opened his office for general practice in Troy until his employment by the County. He and his wife, Harriet, reside at 2915 Livernot Ave., Troy. They have six children, five boys and one girl, ranging in age from 2 to 20.

Michigan's 1850 constitution was a good one as it applied to agriculture which was the basic industry at the time. But since then manufacturing and tourist industries have come to the state. The proposed new constitution is fashioned for all three industries.
