

# OLS Matmen Place 2nd At Class B Regionals

Stan Secosky, the scrappy 138-pound Junior wrestler for Our Lady of Sorrows High School, who has turned into the winning junior athlete in Lancer's history with an undefeated dual meet streak extending into the second year, played a key role in unquestioned fashion last week at the Regional Class B Wrestling Tournament held at River Rouge, when he took the Championship in his weight division. 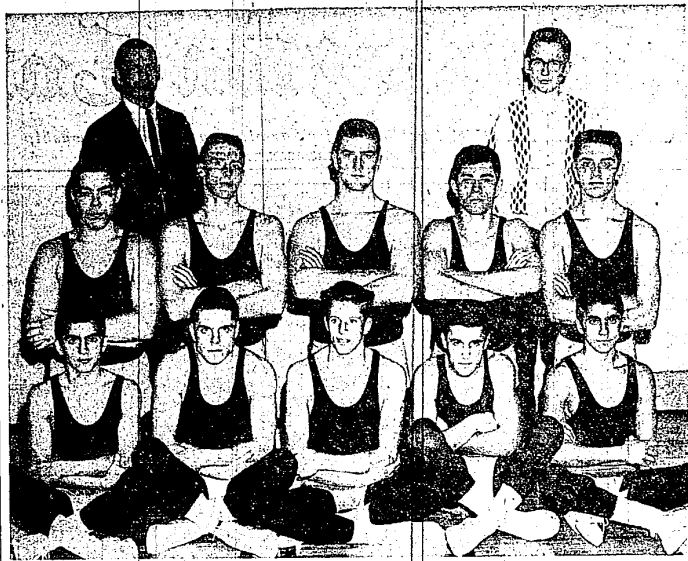
