Deny Request To Solicit Here

What to do about the ever increasing number of requests being received from organizations outside the community for permission to conduct fund raising projects locally came in for an hour and a half of discussion at the regular City Council meeting Monday night.

It is a matter that councilmen have expressed concern about frequently in the past, but upon which no firm policy has yet been decided on.

The latest request stimulating discussion is one received two weeks ago from the Detroit Chapter for Aiding Leukemia Stricken children seeking permission to solicit contributions door-to-door on May 5 and awarded in any year depends upon the extent of sponsor participation.
