Lutherans Set Building Fund Goal of \$40,000

Mr. Harold Nielsen, General Chairman of the Church Building Fund Campaign being conducted at Antioch Lutheran Church, announced today that the congregation has agreed that its goal for the campaign now under way.

A financial goal of \$40,000 for the two-year period has been accepted. A portion of these funds will be applied to the requirement of the First Phase of the current mortgage program, while the largest share will be placed against the Second Phase mortgages thus allowing a more favorable mortgage condition in anticipation of the construction of the new church of the congregation's ultimate plan in the near future.

THE CURRENT campaign is being conducted under the supervision of the Capital Funds Counseling Service of the Lutheran Laymen's Movement for Stewardship of the Lutheran Church in America. Mr. Amos W. Flint, prominent Lutheran layman from Baltimore, Maryland, serves as the LLM Consultant.

Building Fund Commitments will be received during the Every Member - A Week campaign to be conducted among the members of the congregation this coming Sunday.
