Interim Tie-In To Sub. Water System Okayed

Board of Education took action at their last regular meeting approving a hookup to water lines of the Kimbrey South subdivision development for an interim period to supply water to the new East Junior High being built.

These lines which are now about to be laid under supervision of the county department of public works are being engineered to become a part of the Detroit water system soon to serve a substantial portion of Farmington Township.

A line running from the subdivision system to the school on Middlebelt Road between 10 and 11 Mile roads will be needed but it will not be a wasted line since it will be shifted over to carry Detroit water as soon as it becomes available.

Supr. G. V. Harrison told the Board Monday night, however, that he had been informed by Detroit water officials that it might be as late as the end of the year before Detroit water would be available in the township as far north as this school site. The transmission lines carrying Detroit water into the township will originate from the main on Eight Mile Road, the southern boundary of the township.

Since the East Junior High is scheduled for opening in September it was felt wise to make this interim arrangement because of the possibility Detroit water might not be available this far north before the end of December.

It was pointed out during discussion prior to the Board's action that most of the money spent for a new line now would be recovered since the district's amount of assessment for tying into the Detroit system when the switch-over is made will be reduced.



U of M Student Award Winner


