## Fifth Anniversary Services Slated for St. John's Lutheran

The Rev. Robert Wiellmann, assistant to the President of the Michigan District of the American Lutheran Church, will preach April 28, at the 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. services at St. John's Lutheran Church of Farmington.

Rev. Wiellmann, who is a member of the Michigan District Missions Committee and the former pastor of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Royal Oak, will join the congregation of St. John's in commemorating the fifth anniversary of their formal organization.

**THE FIFTH ANNIVERSARY** observance will begin with two worship services Sunday morning, April 28. An anniversary luncheon will be served following the 11 a.m. service. A short program is planned during which an original poem, written by the Rev. Louis H. Perner, especially for the occasion, will be read. The charter members of St. John's will also be introduced.

The congregation of St. John's feels that they have been richly blessed during their years of growth. They look back to 1958, when a survey indicated a need for a Lutheran church in the area. In 1957 the American Lutheran Church purchased five acres of farm land on Gill Rd., at the foot of Alta Loma, from Mr. Ray Ackerson. The property was cleared and the farmhouse torn down in preparation for the construction of a parsonage and church.

Until the church building was constructed in 1958 the members of St. John's worshipped in the basement of the Farmington Junior High School. Pastor Don Good was the first pastor of St. John's. In 1960 the Rev. Robert Wiellmann was called as interim pastor until the congregation issued a call to Pastor Charles Fox. Pastor Fox accepted the call and has served St. John's since June 22, 1961.

During the five years since her organization, St. John's Lutheran Church has grown from a mission church with a small congregation to a well established, self-supporting church. They are looking forward to many years of service to the community and invite the people of the area to come and worship with them each Sunday morning at 8:30 a.m. or 11 a.m.
