This would be quite a chore for the simple reason that hair does not have roots. . . . Contrary to the belief in some quarters that hair growth is a rather consistent half inch per month, the truth is that hair grows in relation to its diameter. Larger diameter hair can grow as much as three times as fast as hair of the smallest diameter and the rate of growth can be expected to fall between four and twelve inches per year with few exceptions.
