Half of Local
Grads Want
Comm. College

The need for community colleges in this area will be dramatized next month when the Class of '63 graduates from high school.

According to a survey made of these students last spring, a community college would make a difference in the educational plan of half.

The final report of the Oakland County Citizen's Advisory Council, made last June, estimated 4,437 of the 8,200 eleventh graders in the County would consider going to a community college within driving distance of their homes. Almost two thousand students stated they would enroll in a community college if one were within driving distance of their homes. Slightly more than two thousand said they would probably enroll if a community college one were available.

Almost a fifth of this year's graduates are interested in further courses which could be obtained at a four-year college.

A bill now awaiting the governor's signature will give County residents a chance to vote for a community college in June 1966. The college would consist of three campuses, one in Troy, one in Farmington, and a third in the Farmington-Nova area. If the vote carries, first classes would begin in September, 1966. A board of six trustees is to be elected and a one-mill tax voted for support of the college.
