Retiring Police Sgt. Honored for Service

A police sergeant who has given a lifetime of service to the people of Detroit was honored recently in a luncheon ceremony at the Detroit District offices of the Michigan Department of State.

Secretary of State James M. Hare was on hand to present an award for service to retiring Sgt. William A. Sloan, 32631 Westmarch St., Farmington.

Sgt. Sloan has represented the Detroit Police Department on the Michigan Department of State's License Appeal Board, an unique group established to hear cases of traffic police violators appealing decisions of Department of State examiners.

During these ten years, Sgt. Sloan has heard and assisted in decisions affecting the driving privileges of approximately 500 Detroiters. He entered into television as the "heavenly" "Up For Appeal", a popular TV show that dramatized the decisions of the License Appeal Board.

Sgt. Sloan was appointed as a patrolman in the Detroit Police Department in 1935, moving upward through the ranks as he progressed through years of service. From 1949 to 1951 he worked with the Department liquor licensing division and in 1951 was made a Sergeant in the stationary traffic division, joining the Michigan Department of State.
