

City Council Proceedings

A special meeting of the Council of the City of Farmington was held on May 27, 1963, for the purpose of Council Organization. Meeting called to order at 8:20 p.m. by Mayor Lindbert. Roll Call: Councilmen Brotherton, Forrest, Lindbert, Peterson and Thayer present. Absent: None. City Officials Present: City Manager, Clerk, Quinlan and Attorney Kelly. Organization of City Council. A. OATH OF OFFICE. Councilmen Henry B. Forrest, Hugo E. Peterson and Howard V. Thayer were sworn in by the Clerk. B. APPOINTMENT OF TEMPORARY CHAIRMAN. Motion by Brotherton seconded by Thayer that City Manager Dinan be appointed as temporary Chairman. Motion carried all ayes. C. ELECTION OF MAYOR. Temporary Chairman Dinan asked for nominations for the office of Mayor. Motion by Brotherton seconded by Peterson to nominate Robert B. Lindbert for the office of Mayor. Motion by Peterson seconded by Brotherton for the office of Mayor Pro-Tem. Motion by Thayer seconded by Lindbert that nominations for the office of Mayor Pro-Tem be closed. Motion carried, all ayes. Ballots were distributed with the following results: (Votes counted by Chairman Dinan and tabulated by Clerk Quinlan.) Three (3) votes cast for Brotherton. Two (2) votes cast for Peterson. Temporary Chairman Dinan declared Wilbur V. Brotherton elected as Mayor Pro-Tem. The Temporary Chairman declared the organization of the City Council completed and presented the gavel to Mayor Lindbert. Mayor Lindbert expressed his appreciation for the vote of confidence by the members of the Council in his election as Mayor of the City of Farmington. He stated that as Mayor, he would continue to serve for the best interests of the City and that he had equal voting privileges as a member of the Council with no veto power. The Mayor stated that he would welcome any suggestion or criticism from the Council members that would improve Council procedure. Adjournment. Local Community College Bd. Candidate Outlines Program

At the School Election on June 10, 1963, the question of establishing the Oakland County Community College District, supported by a 1 mill tax and election of a six-member Board of Trustees will appear on the Ballot. This will be submitted as a separate special election in conjunction with the Annual School Election.

By holding the special election in connection with the Annual School Election, I understand that from \$50,000 to \$60,000 will have been saved. This is a savings of two or more very fine classrooms.

Several community colleges already exist in Michigan. Their purpose is to bring a two-year course of study within commuting distance of high school graduates and others who, for various reasons, cannot seek higher education in a four-year college or university. The community colleges are to offer two years of liberal arts with transfer privileges to four-year institutions of learning; together with two years of terminal instruction in technical and practical subjects geared to the needs of the local business community. Some provision will no doubt be made for some special summer programs and for adult education.

The cost to the student would be in the neighborhood of \$100.00. Because Clarenceville, prior to the completion of the 1962 study, voted to become a part of the Oakland County community college district, it was not possible, under the then existing law, to submit this question to the balance of the County. Legislative amendments were required. These amendments were by the 1963 Legislature. By signature of Governor Romney, they became law shortly before the deadline for filing petitions for the June 10th School Election.

A list of 15 tentative candidates with geographical distribution from the county, was made. Twenty-nine candidates took out petitions; twenty-seven candidates filed.

T. Woodell Brown, a candidate at Monday's election for a seat on the Oakland County Community College Board, I am interested in serving in this capacity because:

Several thousand young people in Oakland County urgently need, at relatively low cost, opportunity to obtain education, methods, sustaining, useful citizens. Oakland County Community College will meet these human needs by uncovering, developing and utilizing otherwise wasted skills.

As a Trustee, I could contribute my years of experience in law, education and government and is a June 10th election to help work for the success of this worthy human endeavor.

At the June 10th Election, I urge a vote, in favor of the proposition to create the Oakland County Community College, with the 1 mill levy in support thereof and for a Board of six trustees.

EDITORS NOTE: Brown is well qualified to serve in this capacity. A practicing attorney with considerable experience, he was a member of the Farmington Board of Education from 1959 until 1962 and president of the Board for the last four of these years.

He served on the Farmington Township Board as a Trustee from 1959 until 1962. Brown is a member and former director and president of the Farmington Friends of the Library and former president of the Farmington Branch of the Oakland County Lincoln Republican Club.

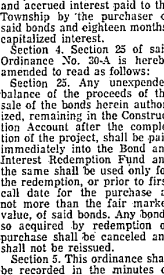
