

Grid Scores in Tee Ball Play

"With scores running into 'football game' figures the North Farmington Tee Ball League is off to its best start since its inception four years ago. Two hundred and twelve youngsters ages eight and nine participate in this unusual version of little league baseball, where they hit the ball off a specially constructed batting 'tee' rather than swinging at a pitched baseball.

PROVIDING tremendous enjoyment for parents as well as the players these teams play two or three times weekly in capacity crowds in a program unmatched anywhere in Michigan. While they do go home somewhat exhausted after a hard day of base running they have begun to learn the fundamentals of team participation and sportsmanship, as well as the "hard knocks of baseball."

The North Farmington Baseball Program has become unique in being one of the largest baseball groups in the Midwest still completely financed by parents and local merchants donations. No public funds are required. Commissioner of Baseball Frank R. Reynolds reports that the league has just signed Registrant No. 960 for the 1963 season and officials will continue to welcome additional sign-ups until June 20.

As in past years with the co-operation of the Enterprise, scores and standings of all divisions will be published weekly. League officials are hoping that parents will follow the activities of their favorite teams in the Enterprise and come put the new bleachers to good use.

Hunt Stars in County Track Meet for FHS

The Farmington thindlads captured sixth place in the annual Oakland County Meet as Dennis Hunt won the county record for the mile run with an excellent 4:24.4 clocking.

Frank Patterson also placed for the Falcons as he took third in the 120 yard high hurdles in 1:52. Pete Sartin placed second in the high jump with a leap of 6'. The 880 yard relay team of Russ Robinson, Gary Lockwood, Frank Patterson, and John Lockwood took fourth place in 1:33.5.

Pontiac Central easily captured the team honors with a Birmingham Scholm following.

FHS Thindlads Capture League Track Title in Conference Meet

The Farmington High track team powered its way to the Inter-Lakes Conference Championship last week at Southfield, taking first places in the 880 yard run, both the high and low hurdles, and the 880 yard relay. The order of finish was as follows: Farmington, 44 points; Walled Lake, 37; Pontiac Northern, 33; Berkley, 29; Waterford, 25; and Southfield, 21.

Dennis Hunt was one of the three record breakers of the meet, capturing first place in the 880 yard run in a blazing 1:57.0. Two other records were broken - in the pole vault by Erwin of Waterford, and in the high jump by Farmington's Pete Sartin jumped higher than he ever had before, clearing 6'.

However, Southfield's Jack also cleared this height and took first place on fewer misses. Lyles of Waterford captured third.

The Falcons had no one place in the broad jump as Garrels of Walled Lake took the top spot with a leap of 19' 8". Harris of Pontiac Northern and Picher of Walled Lake took second and third, respectively.

In the pole vault a real battle was staged between Robinson of Walled Lake and Barrett of Berkley. Picher finally won with a record vault of 13' 1". Barrett took second, and his teammate Kniff took third.

Erwin of Waterford smashed another record in the shot put with a put of 51' 2". Lamb of Southfield was second, and Kaiser of Waterford captured third.

At the end of the field events Farmington seemed to be in real trouble with only four points Sartin picked up in the high jump. However, it turned out the Falcon thindlads made up for the loss of points in the field events by placing twelve times in the running events.

Harris and Perry of Pontiac Northern finished first and second in the 100 yard dash, but Farmington's Russ Robinson and John Lockwood, and Gary Lockwood picked up points by placing third, fourth, and fifth. Harris' winning time was 10.4 seconds.

N. Farmington Colt League To Open June 8

Four teams of newly established North Farmington Colt League open their initial season on June 8 at the North Farmington High School No. 1 diamond.

At 1 p.m. the Yankees will meet the Tigers followed by the Indians vs. Senators game at 3:30 p.m.

THIS LEAGUE, made up of 15 and 16 year old boys, plays a 15 game schedule through the next seven weeks in preparation to entering the Colt League Championship Tournament commencing early in August.

The majority of these ball players are securing additional experience prior to joining their high school league for the 1963 season.
