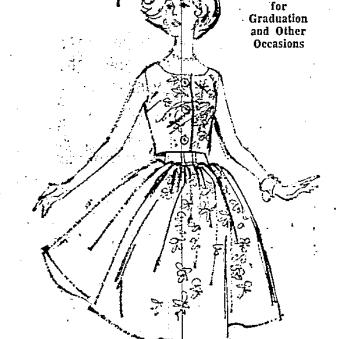

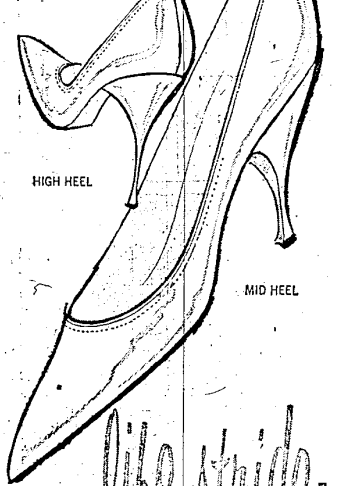

Defer Action on Large Canopy

The City Council decided Monday night to defer any action on a request from Stanley Nielson, owner of the Danish Inn adjacent to the Farmington Lanes bowling alley to erect a large canopy at the front of his business establishment.

Councilmen agreed that since this canopy would extend out into public right-of-way under the jurisdiction of the state highway department Nielson should first obtain approval from the highway department.

A fiber-glass canopy with an identifying sign on it, 17 by 25 feet in size and eight feet high is proposed by Nielson. It would come within 10 feet of the existing sidewalk on Grand River.

Nielson wishes to install the canopy with sign on it to help identify the location and protect customers coming into his restaurant-cocktail lounge. It is being somewhat blocked off from view on the west by the bowling alley.

Even if the state highway department does approve the extension onto the right-of-way, at least a couple of councilmen indicated they would question the advisability of allowing the sign to be put up. Their feeling was that it might result in a safety hazard.

Open Babe Ruth Baseball Play
