A parade route has been approved by action of the City Council taken on Monday evening at their regular meeting which will have area youngsters forming ranks at the old Town Hall and riding east on Grand River to School Street and onto the Farmington Junior High parking lot where the events of the day will unfold. Parade starting time is 9:30 a.m.

Expect Record Turnout At Jaycee Bike Rodeo

Approximately 300 Farmington City and Township youngsters are expected to wheel their bicycles through a test driving course, submit them to a safety inspection and have them marked with reflective tape during the Farmington Junior Chamber of Commerce Bike Rodeo to be held Saturday, June 8, at the Farmington Junior High School parking lot on School Street.

Participants are asked to meet at the municipal building parking lot at 9:30 a.m. to join the parade which will proceed to the area of the Rodeo.

DICK HEMLEY, Jaycee Bike Rodeo chairman, said the bicycle safety committee responsible for the program has stocked enough reflective tape to mark the bicycles of all the school-age cyclists in the community who participate.

The Jaycees will place markings of white reflective tape on the handlebars and forks of bicycles of the rodeo participants and strips of brightly reflective tape on the rear fenders to enable motorists to see bicyclists at night from distances as far away as 2,500 feet. The tape glows brightly in automobile headlight beams.

A look on bicycle safety and maintenance, compliments of the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company, will be given to each participant along with free hot dogs and Pepsi Cola.

Contestants in the competitive events will compete against children in their own age group and trophies will be awarded to the various winners as well as a trophy for the best decorated bicycle in the parade.

Heart Attack Claims Daniel Burnett at 62

Funeral services will be held tomorrow, June 7, for Daniel Burnett who was stricken with a heart attack two weeks ago and succumbed in Henry Ford Hospital on Tuesday, June 4. He was 62 years old.

Dan Burnett came to the community 22 years ago and was familiar to many residents who knew him while he and his late brother, William "Bill" Burnett, operated a fueling gas station on Grand River and Cass Avenue in Farmington. Dan sold the gas station in 1955 following the death of his brother, killed in an auto crash.

HE HAD MADE his home with his wife, Anne Mae, who survives him, at 32334 Shawwas Street in Farmington. For the past eight years he had been employed at the Farmington Post Office.

He was born February 8, 1901, in England and served with the Royal Canadian Air Force during World War I. He came to the United States in 1923 from Canada and first worked for the Ford Motor Company in Detroit. He was married August 11, 1936. There are no children.

The body is resting at the Spencer J. Heeney Funeral Home on Farmington Road where services will be conducted at 1 p.m. Sunday with the Rev. Richard Maridam, pastor of the First Methodist Church where the deceased was a member officiating. Burial will be at Woodlawn Cemetery in Detroit.
