Science Query Wins for Youth At Longacre

An important element of education, alertness as to what is going on and the opportunity for learning, paid off for Kipp Seger, 11, a fifth grade student at the Longacre Elementary School in Farmington.

Kipp is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert A. Seger of 2009 Drake Road and is the proud owner of a set of Britannica Junior Encyclopedias for his efforts in a recent newspaper contest.

KIPP WON the 45 volume set of reference books as his prize for submitting a class science language lesson question, "Is Virus Alive?", to a nationwide children's column dedicated to answering children's questions on all subjects. The feature "Tell Me Why" is sponsored by the Detroit Free Press.

All the fifth graders of Mr. Maynard Harris' Longacre School, class wrote questions they wished to have answered as part of a language lesson in letter writing. Kipp's question was one of the many that were left unanswered at the end of the class's unit study and was sent in with that group to the Free Press contest.

IN THE LETTERS that were completed by the class were the skills and understanding in language and spelling learned during the year. In addition, the project became a person-to-person lesson in science.

"Thus, as a result, learning became a more interesting and integral part of each student's life," commented Maynard Harris, fifth grade teacher at Longacre.

"In a way, the whole class won," Harris said, "for Kipp decided to share his 15 volume set with his class for the rest of the year." (The answer to Kipp's question was published in the May 21 Free Press).
