### New Nardin Park Methodist Church Planned in Township

Facts about the new Nardin Park Methodist Church, which is to be built on the south side of Eleven mile road just off of Middlebelt, were presented at a meeting of the Kimberley Civic Association held in the Beechview School, Wednesday evening, June 19.

After the reading of the minutes, President David O. Wetmore introduced Dennis O. Rippert, Chairman of the Building Committee, and Richard Jeffery, of the Finance Committee of Nardin Park, to the large assembled group which included representatives of the Springbrook Civic Association; Mr. William Goff, Mr. Lloyd Callahan, Mr. L. Peterson, and Mr. H. Bailey.

MR. RIPPERT began by saying the new church which will cost about a half million dollars will be a three unit, one story type structure containing a sanctuary, an educational unit and a fellowship hall. There will be special emphasis on youth activities particularly the Boy Scout work.

In answer to a question, Mr. Jeffery said the new church style will be modified contemporary architecture - to blend with surrounding buildings in the area. Parking will be off-street.

He spoke of the work of Bishop Marshall Reed on the project and of the past work of Dr. Verner S. Mumbulo at Nardin and invited anyone not a member of some other church to visit and become one in Methodist under the leadership of our new Pastor, the Rev. William D. Mercer.

Actual work on the new church is expected to begin this October.

Harold Fisher and Associates are the architects. The plans are to be completed in the near future.
