Engineer With Edison 41 Years Retired June 1

Edward G. Ziegler of 33718 Grand River, Farmington, Michigan, retired June 1 as senior district planning engineer for Detroit Edison's general engineering department after nearly 41 years of service with the company.

Mr. Ziegler, who was born in Calumet, Michigan, attended the University of Michigan where he earned an electrical engineering degree in 1922.

SOON AFTER graduation he joined Detroit Edison as a field engineer assigned to planning electrical facilities in Oakland County. Later, he transferred to the Detroit division of the planning engineering department as district planning engineer and was promoted to senior district planning engineer in 1963.

Mr. Ziegler is a veteran of World War I in which he served with the U. S. Navy and is a member of Thomas A. Edison Post of the American Legion.

He also is a Registered Professional Engineer and a member of the Engineering Society of Detroit and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers.

It was his recommendation that stop signs be erected at Flanders where both of these other streets intersect it. The city manager agreed to investigate the matter in more detail and if stop signs are felt to be the answer to proceed in having them erected.

Councilman Hugo Peterson also reported that he felt something should be done to make conditions safer on Maple Street south of Grand River. The manager also agreed to investigate the situation on this street. He indicated that in this case it might be necessary to restrict parking along the street on one or both sides.

with the television news department's evening program personalities. He has also done a considerable amount of freelance air work with Detroit and national advertising agencies.

A RESIDENT of Farmington for the past six years, McNeeley attended Youngstown Ohio University before coming to the Detroit area. He is a veteran and performed with the Armed Forces Radio Service on a world-wide network for two years. At WRCV-TV in Philadelphia, Meeting Tonight—Legion Post

McNeeley will perform as master of ceremonies for a 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. weekly daytime program consisting of news and information.
