We have no idea how much money might be saved in pay for cafeferia employees, on kitchen equipment needed to be purchased and kept in good-repair and in floor space required by having youngsters from three or more schools fed from one kitchen district wide, but we would expect that the savings would be substantial.

It is not our intention to imply that we feel our school officials have always been as economicals as they could have been in the areas of construction and operations. We have, been critical of some of their expenditures in the past and will continue to be in the future whenever we feel that the expenditures made are unnecessary or extravagant.

For the most part; however, we feel that each and every citizen should, be proud of the job our local school officials have done in trying to provide the best possible school system we can have but

We need more traffic controls and expanded police departments not just here but state-wide.

Funds for 200 additional Michigan state troopers were provided, a central driver license file system established, a high school driver education program started, a maximum 65 mile per hour speed limit established and the Michigan State University Highway. Traffic Safety Center was set up.

We join with Mr. Weil. in saying, Michigan needs this same bold kind of action again right how.

If the trend this year in Michigan continues, roughly one out of every 10 Michigan drivers is going to tave an accident and one in every 20 will be in invert. There is also going to be one in every 2,500 driving or traveling on our highways who is going to be continued.
