City Manager John Dinan recommended that Drinker be retained by the city to finish out work on a master plan now nearing completion and also be retained as the city's consultant in the future.

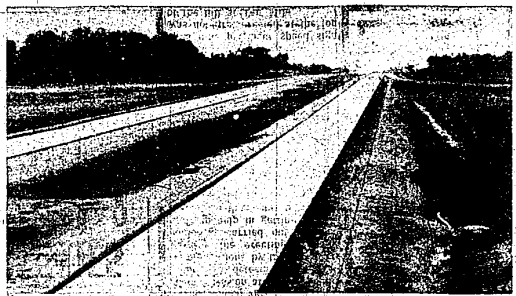
Councilmen were in agreement that Drinker should be kept on to complete the master plan but were hesitant about retaining him beyond this point.

SERIOUSLY injured when his car left the road and crashed into a clump of trees along 11 Mile Road between Middlebelt and Inkster roads in the Township was 19-year-old Carl Muns of 29225 Greening, in Farmington. The accident occurred at 7:50 a. Saturday morning, August 3.

IN A RATHER spectacular accident that fortunately resulted in only a minor injury to the driver, a car careened across the front lawns of several homes along Inkster Road between Nine Mile Road and Devoan Street.

William R. Loney, 70, of Detroit, told Township Police he blacked out while attempting to make a turn at Nine Mile and Inkster. His car jumped the ditch on the west side of Inkster and swerved south along the sidewalk for one block, hitting a parked car in the driveway at the home of John M. Sedor of 22135 Inkster and finally came to a halt after striking a brick entrance marker at Devoan and Inkster, partially destroying it.

Loney was taken to Redford Medical for treatment of minor injuries.

Sedor's car was knocked into his home by the force of the impact and was extensively damaged. Twenty gallons of gasoline spilled out onto his lawn and his car had to be towed away.

Township Police said their switchboard was jammed with telephone calls as apparently most of the residents along Inkster between Nine Mile and Devoan called in to report the accident.

The Council agreed to meet in special session after the regular meeting to determine what recommendations by the police regarding the erecting of signs could be carried out immediately to help in getting drivers to reduce their speeds through the subdivision.
