Two From OLS Receive Habits

In a dramatic ceremony, presided over by the retired Auxiliary Bishop Henry E. Donnelly of Detroit, 37 candidates from seven states and the Dominican Republic, received the habit of St. Dominic August 6 at the Dominican Motherhouse in Adrian, Michigan.

Down the aisle of Beautiful Lumen Chapel, proceeded the young women, including two from Our Lady of Sorrows parish, garbed in white satin with tulle veils and flowered wreaths. With a single gesture, they removed the wreaths and tossed them over their right shoulders, as a symbol of their renunciation of worldly attachments.

After the Mass, offered by Bishop Donnelly, sung by the liturgical choir of novices, the candidates returned to the chapel in the stark white habit of the Dominican order.

MONSIGNOR Jerome V. McLaughlin of East Lansing delivered the address in the presence of twenty magisterial Monsignori and a hundred members of the clergy, including a brown-robed Franciscan. Approximately one hundred members of Our Lady of Sorrows Parish attended the ceremony.

Janet Doyle, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Doyle of Power Road, 1962 graduate of Our Lady of Sorrows High School, and Virginia King, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Cornelius M. King of Valleyview Drive, of the class of 1961, were among the candidates. They will now be known as Sister Marie Joellen and Sister Barbara Maureen, respectively.

Two other Sorrows graduates of the first class of 1961 made their first vows on August 8, with 25 other novices. They are Sister Mary Dolores, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert McGuire of Shiawassee, and Sister Veronica Marie, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Philip Siegenhauer of Farmington Road.
