Miss G. O. P. of Oakland County, Sharon Beaudoin, welcomed the champion steer purchased at the county-wide 4-H Club auction Thursday night in Pontiac. The 970-pound Black Angus steer will provide the piece-de-resistance for the annual Oakland County Republican Picnic and Ox Roast on September 7 at the John F. Ivory Farm. A record price of 60 cents a pound was bid by Charles Lyke, Republican county chairman.

Miss Beaudoin is a secretary at MacManus, John and Adams, Inc. of Bloomfield Hills. She resides in Franklin Village with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Lyke C. Beaudoin.

THE CHAMPION steer was raised by Jerry Langley, 15 years old, of Highland. A member of the Ro-Hi Club, he has been a consistent winner in 4-H livestock events.

The annual Oakland County Republican Picnic and Ox Roast is an all-day affair, starting with a pancake breakfast and ending in late afternoon with an exhibition of Roman riding. A continuing program of entertainment is offered, as well as contests for the adults and games for the children.

Roast beef sandwiches, ice cream, coffee and soft drinks are free, and there is no admission charge. County officials and legislators will man the serving lines. Drawings are held for a variety of door prizes, and additional prizes are offered for the contests and games. There will be free parking provided for an estimated 2,000 cars.

The day's events get under way at 8:30 a.m. and end at 4:30 p.m. The John F. Ivory Farm is located at 9600 Cooley Lake Road, Commerce.

The variety in this area includes swimming, boating and other water recreation; picnicking, fishing and visits to man-made marvels of industry, said Jerry E. Fisher, Automobile Club of Michigan touring manager.

Signal Corps Army Officer

Lt. Lawrence J. Youngblood, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence J. Youngblood of 21420 Gill Road, Farmington, was today listed among the officers recently departing Fort Monmouth.

A 1962 graduate of the University of Detroit, he completed an 11-week course of intensive training as a telephone and telegraph officer at the United States Signal School here on July 15 and was assigned to duty in Korea.

A YEARLY average of 1,500 commissioned officers are graduated from the Signal School's Department of Command Communications, where the emphasis is chiefly upon the design and rapid alteration of battlefield communication systems to meet the requirements of fast-moving combat situations.

The officer students make intensive studies of radio system engineering, telephone traffic engineering, and other aspects of what are called applied communications. They also delve deeply into the tactics of both conventional and nuclear warfare. Other subjects include the techniques of electronic warfare and the use of electronic computers - "electronic brains" in solving various military problems.

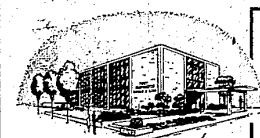

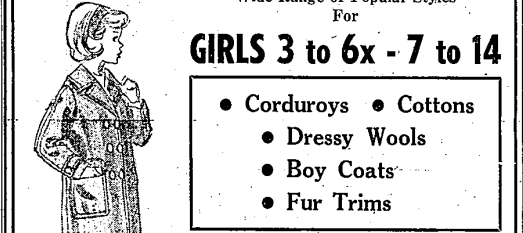
