

## Wd. Ck. Assured Landfill Site Will Be Graded

A speedy completion to final cleaning up operations on the site of an 18-month-old landfill in the Village of Wood Creek was assured to the Village Council on Tuesday night, September 3, when it was revealed the bonding company had retained a landscaper to grade, seed and mulch the two lots on the southeast corner of Wellington Drive and North-western Highway.

The contractor responsible for the landfill operation had given the Council repeated assurances over the past year that final work making the two lots presentable would be performed by him. The Council resorted to asking the bonding company to take action after increased pressure from Village residents, and further appeals to the contractor appeared unlikely of meeting with any success.

## Grant Filling Near River

A request from Omar Sanderson, realtor, for permission to dump fill near the Rouge River Branch to the rear of the service station and new Quick-Pile Food Store at the northeast corner of Grand River and a Power Road was approved by the City Council Tuesday night.

In a report to the Council prior to action, City Manager John Dinan stated that he had investigated the matter and felt that it would not affect the flood plain there, which would be an improvement. It would cover the broken concrete and rubbish dumped there earlier and should improve the general appearance, he stated.

The filling will allow for an ingress and egress to the two business establishments at the rear.

## Mail Thieves Hit Township

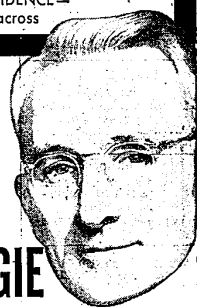

## New Town Hall Lecture Series Set to Open 1963-64 Season

The season is fast approaching when the Northville Town Hall will open its doors to the series of lectures during their 1963-64 season. Season tickets are still available, although a great percentage were sold out the last lecture.

A season ticket includes five lectures starting at 11 a.m. at the P and A Theatre in Northville, Hall 810 to Northville Town Hall Series, Box 93, Northville, Michigan.

Proceeds of the Town Hall are used for charitable organizations to be divided by Farmington, Plymouth, Livonia and Northville.

## Farmington Seaman On Destroyer Duty

Gilbert J. Murphy, Jr., seaman apprentice, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Gilbert J. Murphy, Sr., of 20815 Cass, Farmington, is serving aboard the guided missile destroyer USS BUCHANAN, a Pacific Fleet unit currently operating with the Seventh Fleet in the Western Pacific.

BUCHANAN deployed to the Far East in April.

PORTS OF CALL during the cruise include Melbourne, Australia; Guam, Mariana Islands; Subic Bay and Manila, Philippines; Hong Kong, British Crown Colony; and Yokosuka and Sasebo, Japan.

BUCHANAN carries "Tartar" and "ASROC" (anti-submarine rocket) weapon systems protecting the force from air attacks and long-range submarine attacks. BUCHANAN also has a secondary anti-air warfare capability in her 6" 54 rapid fire gun battery, as well as surface and shore bombardment capabilities.

## Farmington Sailor Aboard Destroyer

Robert E. McKibben, gunner's mate third class, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl L. McKibben of 20850 Cass, Farmington, Mich., is serving aboard the destroyer USS JAMES C. OWENS currently on four months deployment with the Sixth Fleet in the Mediterranean.

THE OWENS visited Naples, Italy, Aug. 31 on the first leg of the current Mediterranean tour. In addition to her normal operating schedule as a Sixth Fleet unit, the OWENS is among several U.S. destroyers carrying clothing and books donated by "Project Handclasp" in support of the President's "people-to-people" program.

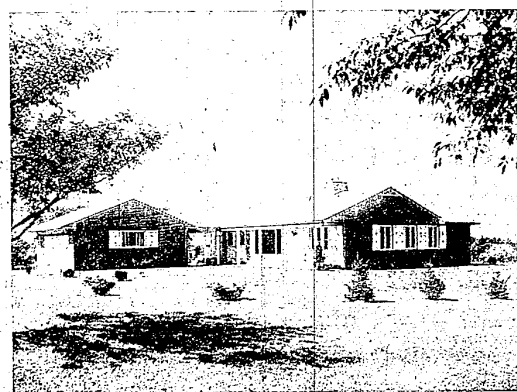
