A good example was provided last week when the story came out about the "big bust" debutante party in New York where supposedly well educated and well-to-do kids did nearly \$10,000 worth of damage to a fashionable mansion rented for their use.

And what was the attitude of the young man who broke a very expensive chandleier. "So I have to pay for one chandeller! Big deal!
