PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CHARTER OF THE VILLAGE OF QUAKERTOWN 1. Paragraph (a) of Section 9 of Chapter III' to be amended as follows:

o he amended as follows:

(a) The President shall be the chief, executive officer by the Village. He shall preside at the meetings of the Council. He shall be deemed a member of the Council with the right to vole upon any question. He shall from time to time give the Council man design the council with the right to vole upon any question. He shall from time to time give the Council and responsed such measures as he may deem expedient. It shall be his duty to exercise supervision over the affairs of the Village and over the public property belonging thereto and to see that the laws righting out the Council are enforced.

Amend Section 12 of Chapter III to read

s follows:

"Section 9.2. The Village Council shall have the power to create the offices of the Village marshall, road commissioner, attorney; additional commissioner, and provided for elsewhere in this Charter. The Village Council shall prescribe the duties thereof and set the compensation therefor, all such offices, and the compensation therefore. 
Notice Relative to Opening and Closing of the Polls
