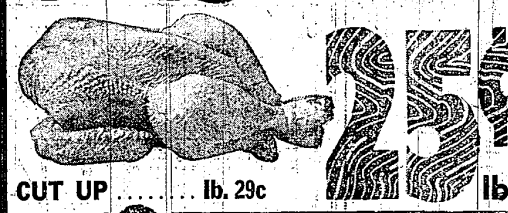
The 524th handled more than two million gallons of petroleum products during the month-long exercise. That's a lot of driving. The 10000 cars drive in a day "fill it up."

Petersmark is a diesel mechanic for the 524th.



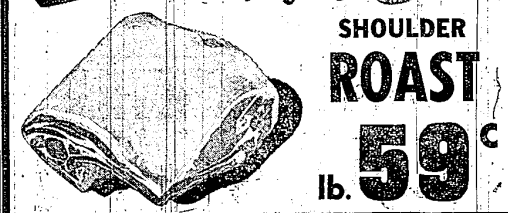
