Bob Hart got into the scoring column for the Lancers with his successful boot for the point after the touchdown following a run to victory with the errant St. Mary's pass.

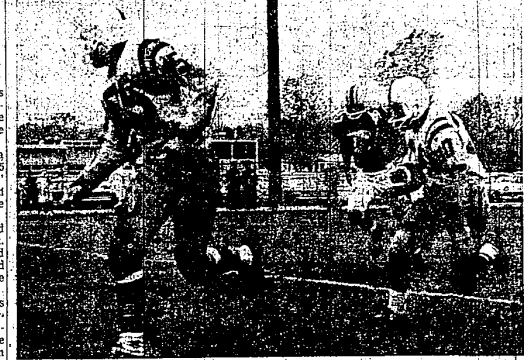
