500 Attend 1st Sex Education Program Here

Over 500 parents and junior high students have been in attendance at the new program of sex education as sponsored by the local YMCA.

Conducting a series of three lectures, the program is being held at Duncklin Junior High for three consecutive Tuesday evenings which began October 15.

The leadership for this program is being provided by three highly qualified persons: Dr. Edwin Blumberg, who is a practicing physician in Farmington and a member of the YMCA Program Committee; the Reverend Richard Markham, pastor of the First Methodist Church of Farmington; and Dr. Paul Kauffman, clinical psychologist at Hawthorne Center in Northville.

THE OBJECTIVES of this new program are fourfold:

- 1.) To achieve a better understanding of the human body and all its processes.
- 2.) To learn of the physiological changes that girls and boys undergo during adolescence.
- 3.) To provide a clearer understanding of sex and reproduction.
- 4.) To promote a closer, more comfortable relationship between parents and their youngsters.

Farmington Players to Stage Patrick's 'The Curious Savage'

Another comedy success by John Patrick, author of "The Hasty Heart," has been selected by the Farmington Players as its next presentation. This is a whimsical parable called "The Curious Savage," which will open Nov. 15 at the Barn in 12 Mile Rd., continuing through Nov. 16, 22, 23 and 24.

"The Savage" of this comic farce is a non-university, uneducated, but a gentle old lady of wealth named Ethel Savage, who is "lurking" in a most charming way. Her eccentricity is a belief in the right of people to indulge their foolish desires.

ETHEL SAVAGE recognizes from personal experience how desperately people need to do this occasionally. She has, for example, dyed her hair blue, "because it goes with anything." Also, she once bought a tomb for a horse, and wrote a play in which she started her own hair business. In this last project, she knew she was bad and that the audience came to laugh at her, but could see no harm in that. A ten million dollar hearse, the "curious Savage" simply decided to do all the silly things she'd always wanted to do. What's more, she's determined to set up a Happiness Fund designed to put her millions to work helping people do silly foolish things.

In order to keep her from thus wasting the family fortune, her three officious stepchildren have her thrust into a retreat for a group of people who have fled from reality, and found refuge in one harmless illusion or another. Of course the greedy children's hope is that they can eventually have the widow declared insane and thereby gain control of the Savage millions.
