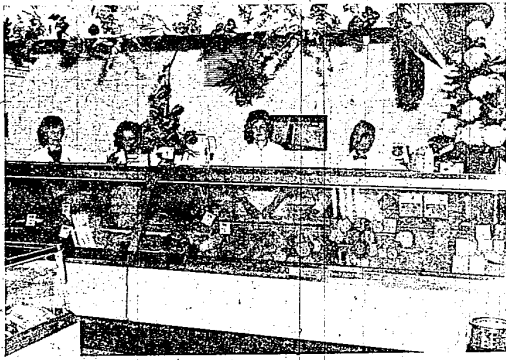

The Model United Nations of FHS opened the 1963-64 school year at its first meeting on Tuesday, October 15, by electing its chairman, Keith Thompson. He was chosen by his fellow UN'ers Mike Bacon, Richard Bradbury, R. O. Brown, Ruth Dodd, Mike Gale, and Perry Jamison.

They met every Thursday morning before school with their sponsor, Mr. Donald Nichols. Their agenda for the present time consists of setting up a model Security Council. This practice is valuable in understanding the United Nations procedures.

In December at the University of Detroit there is a convention of all Model UN groups from secondary schools in Michigan. At this time, each school chooses two nations from a choice of four to represent them from their group. From then until March, when they send delegates for the assigned countries to Hillsdale College, they set up their model United Nations procedure. At Hillsdale College, where there are representatives from all the secondary schools from the state that take part in this, they enact an actual United Nations.

The Model UN has behind it the object of getting young people interested in the functions of the United Nations and showing how it goes into effect. Concerning the value of Model UN, chairman, Keith Thompson states, "I find the United Nations work very interesting and urge people interested in this area to join."
