The position of Superintendent of the Oakland County Schools has been held by Dr. Emerson since 1949. He received his Bachelor's degree at Central Michigan University and his Master's and Doctor's degrees at Wayne State. He has taught in high school, has been a visiting professor at Michigan State University and Wayne State, where he taught school administration.

DR. EMERSON is President of the Michigan Association of the Intermediate Schools' Administration.

Dr. Emerson is married, has three children, and resides in Pontiac.

Auction Sale Planned Here By Town Club


Town Club cordially invites the general public to attend their annual auction Thursday evening, November 7.


