Dr. Crane, a native of Danville, Ill., holds degrees from the Boston University School of Theology and Harvard University, as well as several honorary degrees.  
He was one of the first Detroit ministers to preach in favor of racial integration, and during his pastorate at Central Methodist Negro members were brought into the church, the oldest Protestant church in Michigan.  
As a pacifist, he frequently blasts what he calls the "profit motive of thinking," and asserts that almost the whole American economy is built on the sale of bombs, missiles and armaments, a fact he says is essential to the survival of the United States.  
Dr. Crane is minister emeritus of Central Methodist Church in Detroit. He retired from active ministry in 1958 after 20 years at Central Methodist, but remains an active and outspoken liberal and pacifist, and averages almost a speech a day while traveling all over the country.

**To Institute Rev. Pelham as Church Rector**  
The Rev. Joseph A. Pelham will be installed as Rector of Trinity Episcopal Church this Friday (the Festival of All Saints) during the church's annual service at 8 p.m. at the Church, 26380 LaMue Drive, Farmington.

The Rt. Rev. Robert L. DeWitt, Suffragan Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan, will conduct the Service of Installation and be the preacher. Other clergy participating in the service will be the Rev. Erville B. Maynard, Jr., Director of the Flint Industrial Mission; the Rev. Robert H. Rich, Rector of Christ Church, Henrietta, Michigan; and the Rev. Gerald B. O'Grady, Jr., Rector of Christ Church Cranbrook, Bloomfield Hills.

The Service of Installation is the formal liturgical act marking the induction of a minister into the office of a parish as representative of the congregation, into the position of priest and pastor. It is conducted immediately at the beginning of the ministry of a priest in a parish or may follow after several months.

THE SERVICE, which has no civil or ecclesiastical force, but only an educational and devotional value, is mediated in its origin, dating from the time when, according to feudal custom, the clergyman was presented with a benefice. Usually this was done by a layman, more often than not a layman, until the reign of Richard I (1189-99), when the right of institution was vested in the bishop of the diocese or one delegated by him. Today it serves as a dramatic reminder to the new Rector of a parish of his own duties as pastor of the people and of the congregation of the ministry in which it shares as the People of God.
