**Negro Sculptor To Appear Here**  
One hundred years ago, when the Underground Railroad was splitting slaves northward and the Farmington Universalist Church was one of its stations, the Negro leader Sojourner Truth spoke at the church.  
On Sunday, Nov. 10, a sculpture of the famed one-time slave will be exhibited at the church, along with many other pieces to be brought by Negro sculptor and poet Oliver LaGrone.

LaGrone, who has won numerous honors and has considerable stature in artistic and literary fields, will speak at 7:45 p.m. in his appearance sponsored by the church's social action committee. His subject will be "African Art and World Peace."

He is a teacher of arts and crafts in special education classes at Detroit's Goldberg Junior High and also gives much time to help establish an African Art Gallery at the Detroit Institute of Arts.

LaGrone studied at Howard University and was the first American Negro to be admitted to Cranbrook for advanced study in sculpture under world famous Carl Milles. His first one-man show was held in 1955 at the Werthe Gallery.

Two of his poems are included in the recently issued volume "Beyond the Blues," an anthology of recent poems by American Negroes, edited by Dr. Roscoe E. Frazier.

### New Minister Installed At Universalist Church

Robert Miles Eddy was installed Sunday, Nov. 10, as minister of the Universalist-Unitarian Church of Farmington, promising to help bring members of the 110-year-old church "the highest insights of those who throughout history have searched for the deepest meanings of man's experience."

Dr. Henry Hill Crane, minister of Central Methodist church in Detroit, was guest speaker for the occasion, and ministers of other liberal churches in the area took part in the service.

Dr. Martin Gluckstein, church moderator, gave the charge to the 33-year-old minister, saying in part that members believed him to be "a man of integrity, who will say no less and no more than he believes, and a man of liberal spirit who will respect our integrity and subject himself to any test he demands of others."

MR. EDDY also pledged the members "not to dictate truth, but help each of us find truth for ourselves."  
In his sermon, Dr. Crane said a minister's life and work must be based on "right thinking, right living, right acting and right believing."

The new minister came to Farmington in September of this year from the Wayne County Training School in Northville, gave the invocation.
