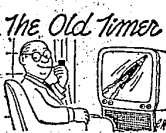


Parking Limit Signs Coming

The big question which probably just about every taxpayer has is how much in additional taxes he is going to have to pay if the proposition calling for a three mill operating tax rate increase is approved.

The following chart worked out by school officials and members of the School Citizens Advisory Committee to give homeowners an idea of what the additional cost to them would be.

The additional monthly cost for the homeowner in a \$10,000 home would therefore be only \$1.60 per month. For the homeowner in the \$25,000 home the monthly cost would run only \$2.50.

IN MAKING projections to determine future needs for both classrooms and operating moneys in the district, school officials have figured that there will be an approximately \$5 million annual increase in the valuation of the district. They also figure an average annual enrollment increase of 1,000

The additional monthly cost for the homeowner in a \$10,000 home would therefore be only \$1.00 per month. For the homeowner in the \$25,000 home the monthly cost would run only \$2.50.

IN MAKING projections to determine future needs for both classrooms and operating monies in the district, school officials have figured that there will be an approximately \$5 million annual increase in the valuation of the district. They also figure an average annual enrollment increase of 1,000 pupils.

Supt. Harrison emphasized that this has been the pattern in past years. Should the district experience substantially higher valuation increases due to heavy commercial and industrial development rather than building, the whole \$5 per \$1,000 may not be necessary in future years, he pointed out.

Approval of the operating levy increase only gives the Board of Education authority to levy the three additional mills if it is needed. If it is found in later years not to be needed, then it will not be levied. In previous years, Farmington voters have authorized the Board to levy substantially more than they actually levied, he stated.

The policy of local school officials in the past has been to levy no more than is needed for any year and it will be the policy in future years as well, the head of the school district concluded.
